
I close with these deeply moving words by Isaac Watts:

A Note from the PNC

Thank you to everyone who participated in our mission discernment event last month. It was a great event, and extremely helpful in establishing the path forward for our committee. We had about 50 members in attendance. We spent time exploring the strengths of our church, the opportunities we face, and our key priorities. We also spent time thinking about the qualities that are most important for the next pastor of our church to have. I've never been more excited about Bethesda's future.

The committee has now begun preparing our Ministry Information Form. You can review the process flow chart included in this month's *Banner* to get an overview of our next steps. Now that we have your input, you will experience a period where you don't hear a lot of updates from us. Know that we remain hard at work discerning the person that God has called to lead our congregation.

Many people have asked what they can do to support our committee, and we really do appreciate all of your support. May I offer the following suggestions:

- 1. Pray for our committee. Please thank God for the love these committee members have for our church and all of you. Pray for our wisdom and patience during this process.
- 2. Be patient. I know it's tempting to ask "Are we there yet?" It may take some time, but it will be worth it to know that we have found the right person.
- 3. Respect the confidentiality of the committee. It's not that we don't trust you, but it is important that potential candidates trust this process.
- 4. Offer words of encouragement for our committee's family members. They are giving up time with their loved ones and picking up many of the responsibilities these committee members would normally assume. Their support is critical to our success.

The Process of Calling a Pastor

without a pastor can be a stressful time in the life of a congregation, yet it is natural and normal to undergo this transition from time to time. The question most PNCs hear from parishioners is, "What's taking so long?" There is much more work to be done between the time one pastor's call is dissolved and a new pastor is approved. The following seven steps, and the accompanying chart, define the process and the timeline involved in calling a new pastor.

1. ORGANIZE

A Pastor Nominating Committee is recommended by the Nominating Committee, approved by the Session and voted upon by the congregation at a Congregational Meeting. The committee members are elected, the PNC meetings begin with guidance from the presbytery's Committee on Ministry.

2. CREATE

The PNC develops the Ministry Information Form (MIF), which includes a detailed description of our congregation and its ministries.

3. SEARCH

he PIFs that match our required competencies and experience. The PNC also seeks and follows up on referrals Personal Information Forms (PIFs) from prospective pastors to the information on our MIF. The PNC is given The MIF is then posted on the PC(USA)'s Church Leadership Connection website. This website helps match and recommendations from a variety of channels.

4. EVALUATE

candidates. When the PNC finds a candidate that everyone on the PNC agrees may be a fit, that candidate further. Pastors who self-refer are also acknowledged. The PNC reviews carefully each PIF of candidates conversation, or Skype with the candidate. The PNC also begins their background and reference checks. When matches arrive from PC(USA), the PNC prayerfully decides which ones they would like to pursue is contacted and asked to send sermons for the PNC to view or the PNC may visit, have a phone they have chosen to pursue, as well as church websites and other materials from and about the

5. SELECT

discussion, and consultation with the presbytery's Committee on Ministry. Ultimately, a call is extended to one The top candidates are selected for face-to-face interviews. This part of the process requires much prayer, candidate.

6. NOMINATE

Pending acceptance of the call, the PNC reports to the Session and the congregation on the chosen candidate. If approved by the congregation and the Presbytery, the new pastor will then begin ministry at Bethesda

7. REJOICE

The PNC, along with the entire congregation, welcomes the new pastor, gives thanks to God, and celebrates the beginning of a new season in church life!

Multiplied - An Update from the Driggers

About 300 of the 800 plus languages in Papua New Guinea (PNG) are Bibleless. Speakers of these languages have no access to the Bible in the language they think in, the language they dream in. But God! On average four New Testaments are completed in PNG each year. We are excited the Lord is affirming our return this summer to support Bible translation in PNG! There is so much for us to do in these last few months here in America. But God! We believe He is working steadily, multiplying our human efforts as only He is able, and in His perfect timing will bring us back to our work. We love our job of loving missionary kids in Ukarumpa and feel a pull on our hearts to return to serving the students and their families in our missionary community. We also deeply love the people and country of Papua New Guinea. And we love what God is accomplishing there.

We have quite a journey ahead of us in order to return to our home in PNG. Since arriving in the States we have had several financial partners who are unable to continue giving. Wycliffe has also approved a budget for our return to PNG that includes an increased cost of living. This translates to a current lack of 34% of our monthly budget. In order to be released to return to our work in PNG, we need to be at 100%. Such substantial need. Such a short amount of time. But God! Every single partnership is vital in multiplying the work of Bible translation in Papua New Guinea. Is God nudging you to become a part of our team? Would you prayerfully consider joining our Wycliffe ministry?

Thank you for your continued investment in our lives. Thank you for working with us to see the world impacted by Bible translation. Praise be to God! May God alone be glorified and honored as we serve and love Him together as His church.
