I find myself yearning for Spring. I find myself waiting for the trees to begin budding, the days to get a little longer, and the warmth of the sun to bring back the color of the grass and cause flowers to bloom. I love spring! I enjoy so much the signs of new and renewed life. I want to see it, taste it, and hear the sounds of birds in the morning. For many of us, spring also is a time where we celebrate Lent. Lent is a time of spiritual reflection and seeking as we prepare to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is also a time where we desire to grow spiritually. How about for you? Have you found this to be true for you as well?

The idea of giving something up for Lent came out of the tradition in the early church as new believers were preparing for their baptisms at Easter, when fasting was used as a spiritual discipline to become aware of our need for God. Fasting or giving up something for Lent can be a good way to explore a deeper expression of faith. But "giving up something" does not just have to be about food. It can also be a time to give up or leave behind all those things that don't nurture you, challenge you, or encourage you on your journey.

What is it you need to leave behind this Lenten season? Another way to observe Lent is to see this as a season to "take on" some new practice of prayer or study ... maybe for you it might be taking a daily walk in silence, or taking time to listen to music that lifts your spirit. Read a book, take time to call a friend, visit with a neighbor who is lonely, or be more disciplined in your reading of God's Word.

This Lent, I invite you to rededicate yourself to your own spiritual journey, turning to our loving God through prayer, worship, and service. In our ministry together, and in your personal family and devotional time, may you seek — and receive — the guidance of God for your own life's journey. I close with this wonderful poem by Christina Rossetti entitled "Lent." May it help to lead you into a deeper faith:

It is good to be last not first,
Pending the present distress;
It is good to hunger and thirst,
So it be for righteousness.
It is good to spend and be spent,
It is good to watch and to pray:
Life and Death make a goodly Lent
So it leads us to Easter Day.

From the Personnel Committee

During 2018 the Session approved changing the organizational structure of the Personnel Committee. This committee was previously composed of all six committee chairs and was chaired by the Clerk of Session. It was designated as a subcommittee of the Administrative/Stewardship Committee and was tasked to meet annually to receive staff evaluations, receive any recommendations concerning salary adjustments, and refer these recommendations through the Administrative/ Stewardship Committee to the Session.

In the process of reviewing the Personnel Policy for the Manual of Operations it was noted that there were several responsibilities specifically designated as responsibilities of the Personnel Committee within the Personnel Policy that were not included in the brief description of responsibilities of this committee. Therefore, at the June 20, 2018 Session meeting, the Session members approved the following changes:

The Personnel Committee is now a standing committee.

The Clerk of Session is designated committee chair.

The Personnel Committee is composed of the following members

Chairs of each committee responsible for overseeing the work of church staff members, as noted:

Administrative/Stewardship Committee—Church Secretary/Bookkeeper Christian Education/Youth Committee—Dir. of Christian Education

Property Committee—Caretaker and Sexton

Worship Committee—Pastor and Music Director

The Church Treasurer

Meetings will be held quarterly or as needed.

Responsibilities of the Personnel Committee have been expanded to include those responsibilities already in place within the Bethesda Personnel Policy.

The Personnel Committee met several times during the year. The committee developed the Responsibilities of the Personnel Committee, based on the Personnel Policy. They received staff evaluations and made recommendations to the Session concerning salary adjustments.

The committee chair also conducted an exit interview with the Director of Children's and Youth Ministry on her departure from Bethesda, as stipulated in the Personnel Policy.

Souper Bowl of Caring Donations

Many thanks to those who donated cans of soup for the Souper Bowl of Caring campaign on February 3rd. Four large boxes of soup and other food items were delivered to the PATH distribution center in York.


Retirement Seminar Offered






