But I have discovered that they can be powerful tools to communicate the Gospel.

We have also learned that no matter what the season, the needs of people do not go away. This has forced us to find ways to continue being ambassadors for Christ through it all. Things like lockdowns and forced quarantines and separations from loved ones have reminded us of the simple joy of being together.

It has been said, "you can't teach an old dog new tricks," but we have proved that no matter how old we may be or what season we are living through, God, with the help of the Holy Spirit, equips us to continue to love and serve. Through the grace of Jesus Christ, with your willingness to be creative in sharing the gospel, we will continue learning and adapting. May God bless us and Bethesda as we go through the seasons of our lives.
