Session Report to the congregation for November, 2021

The Session of Bethesda Presbyterian Church met at 6:00 PM on Sunday November in the Session room. The meeting began with a devotion presented by Elder Trudy Amick followed by Welcoming the new Moderator the Reverend Dr. Derek Marotta. The moderator began with a discussion with the Elders by asking for their understanding of the *"Mission of God."*

Church Financial and Committee reports were received with no discussion Unfinished Business included:

approving several changes and updates to the Session's Manual of Operations.

Other items included:

Progress reports for Consolidation of Cemetery records storage, development of the Church Disaster Preparedness Plan, and further discussion for the Church Security plan related to Concealed Carry requirements for churches.

New Business

Approval of the 2022 church budget. The Session approved an operating budget of \$226,904.93 for 2022. Ordination for New Elders was set for Sunday January 2, 2022

Elder Shepherds contributed reports of their Shepherd folds and the Session continues discussions of ways to ensure all members are connected to the life of the church.

The Session voted to not hold the regular stated meeting in December. The next regular stated meeting will be held at 6:00 PM on Sunday January 16, 2022.

Update from Dr. Tito and La Mision:



In June and July we had the opportunity to make two medical trips in different areas, we worked in Tameja village after a long time. The people received us with too much love and kindliness, thanks to God we attended 173 patients in medicine, dental and glasses area.

We continue our medical trip in San Carlos Village, it was a blessing to see how the people received medicine and food supplements. We attended 153 people.

We went to San Pedro la Cocona village and no matter what the weather was we were able to attended 164 patients delivering medicine and supplements food.

After a year of pandemics, God opened the doors for us to continue doing our medical trips. In this time, we found many diseases like acute gastrointestinal and skin diseases that we had not seen for a long time, we concluded that there was a setback due to the lack of visits of La Mision to these communities. Lack of hygiene and medication were part of this problem. For us it is very important to continue with medical trips and attack these types of diseases, thank to God we were able to bring and deliver medical treatments to control these diseases.

Thanks for your help and support once again we were able to bless 125 families with 1,305 pounds of food. We included incaparina, rice, beans, oatmeal, and sugar. Also La Mision has helped families close to us who are going through difficult times about the pandemic.

Our mission is to share the gospel with all people and one of the ways to do it is that in each bag of food we include a bible devotional that people can read it together as a family

.We delivered nutritional supplements in Sarita and Lampara School, we reached 99 kids from those schools through the scholarship program we keep fighting against malnutrition in our children.

We delivered 1,980 pounds of supplements food, we included incaparina, oatmeal, rice, beans, and sugar.

We ask for your prayers because 16 kids are without sponsors.
