This is a publication of the people of Bethesda Presbyterian Church As we begin January, I want to share with you the author's take on Gratitude. He begins the section by saying, "Gratitude is the moment we turn from seeing dependence as a burden and begin to see it as a gift. Gratitude is the window we are given into how dependence creates relationship." (1)

The author then recalls a detailed story for the reader about an old woman whose eyesight fails to such a degree that she needs her neighbor's child to assist her with reading the mail. From that simple act, the woman begins to see that so many aspects of her life are tied into this child's presence with her. What she anticipated as a burden for the child becomes an opportunity to reflect on the care provided by another person who enters a relationship.

Add to this notion that child's parents notice that their child spent so much time next door that a new relationship is formed between neighbors. All four people became dependent upon each other, in the story, and the new relationship, which began only as a utilitarian duty is now a coveted blessing by all. Our author reflects on this story, and how it shaped all of the individuals involved in it by saying:

"Dependence creates relationship, and relationship unearths untold gifts and assets and blessings and innovations. And gratitude names the process by which the deficits (of life) turn, through our becoming open to one another's gentle companionship and unexpected grace, into assets of discovery...So much of current cultural development tries to address the challenges and traumas of these two neighbors through solutions that can be bought with a card or accessed by a phone. But gratitude knows what such solutions never comprehend. What gratitude knows is that existence is made up of setbacks, mistakes, challenges, and obstacles, and it is in facing and tackling and sometimes enduring those adversities that mortality is discovered, dependence recognized, and relationship sought. And it is in such relationship, and the unanticipated benefits that accompany it, that true joy lies." (2)

In Advent God chose to offer us a relationship based on our future dependence upon Jesus. He chose to be with people who would not always agree or support him, and yet this was God's mission and purpose in sending Jesus for. He could have left us alone but God would not do that. Instead he built something, relationally, that would last for eternity.

As we move in the new year and begin our transition away from Christmas joy and love and peace and hope, I encourage you to take time, make some time, to reflect on the places where God used someone to draw you closer to Him.

It may have been a relationship you did not foster or anticipate, but now, after Advent, this can be a place to express gratitude to God for all that He has done for you and all that God will continue to do in your life.
