Stop and think with me for a minute. . . Put down whatever you are doing. Take a deep breath and consider this question: What is your chief purpose today? What are you attempting to complete or do today?

Now there are a lot of diverse and unique answers that we could offer to this question. Around this time of the year, our days fill easily.

As April begins, the church celebrates and recognizes Palm Sunday. We have Holy Thursday coming up with the Living Last Supper and some new symbolic pieces of worship to attend to that help us reflect on what Jesus did that night. Easter morning is going to be quite busy at Bethesda as we have a 7am service, breakfast, Sunday school, and morning worship. It is quite easy to just rush around on Easter and neglect my beginning question: What are you attempting to complete or do today? But let's not do that.

As the Lenten season concludes, I offer you the words of Thomas Merton as he thought about what his purpose as a Christian was. Perhaps in these words you will find something reflective for your hearts. He wrote:

"My chief care should not be to find pleasure or success, or heath or life or money or rest or even things like virtue and wisdom—still less their opposite, pain, failure, sickness, death. But in all that happens, my one desire and my one joy should be to know: . . . "In this His love is found, and in accepting this I can give back His love to Him and give myself with it to Him. For in giving mayself I shall find Him and He is life everlasting."

Notice how that idea, that we are called to just live in and embrace the love of God in our lives, changes the orientation of our day and the order of our tasks. Notice how your list of tasks on the calendar and appointments to attend to, and considerations of who we need to call and talk with, is reshaped by God's love.

We are supported and built so that we can love God and feel His love in our lives. Certainly a response is called forth. The implication of His divine love will send Jesus to the cross soon, and in response to that act, we must live faithfully and consistently as the Bible teaches.

God asks each of us to come to him and to live in His everlasting love and life. But I wonder if we will come alone? Or will we share what that loves means for, and how it changed us, with another person? Will we hold the miracle of Lent in our hearts alone or will we tell someone else about how we have learned what the chief concern of our lives is supposed to be?

Maundy Thursday - A Remembrance of the Last Supper

Maundy Thursday, also known as "Holy Thursday," commemorates the Last Supper, when Jesus shared the Passover meal with his disciples on the night before he was crucified. The word Maundy is derived from the Latin mandatum which means commandment. It refers to the command Jesus gave to the disciples while washing their feet, as recorded in John 13. This act sets the example that we should love and serve one another in humility.

Jesus knew his earthly ministry was drawing to a close. The events of the week were no surprise to him. The setting was an Upper Room in Jerusalem. He directed Peter and John to prepare the meal and secure the

location where he would share a meal and fellowship alone with his disciples for the last time. It would be "a meal to remember, not only because this event forms the basis of the Lord's Supper, but also because Jesus predicts betrayal, defines true leadership, promises authority to the eleven, predicts Peter's failure, and warns of coming rejection. Even as he faces death, Jesus serves by preparing others for their task." (Biblegateway.com).

Installation of Rev. Dr. Derek Marotta as Pastor of Bethesda Presbyterian Church



Rev. Dr. Derek Marotta will be formally installed as Pastor of Bethesda Presbyterian Church **this** Sunday, April 3, 2022 at 2:00 PM in the sanctuary of Bethesda Presbyterian Church. Providence Presbytery will organize and conduct this service of installation. Installation is an act of the presbytery establishing the pastoral relationship and is conducted in the context of worship. Members of Bethesda are invited to attend this installation service.

The installation service will be followed by a reception in the Fellowship Hall hosted by Bethesda. If you have not signed up to bring a finger food for the reception and would like to help, please contact Ernice. Thank you in advance for your help with this celebration.

Session Highlights for March, 2022

The Session met on Sunday, March 20, 2022. All members were present. Reverend Marotta provided a working session for Elders to reflect on Romans 8:1-10 and an excerpt from Dietrich Bonhoeffer's work "Life Together". The monthly financial report and committee reports were received as information.

The following committee highlights are noted:

Christian Education Committee:

It was reported by the Christian Education committee that there would not be an Easter Egg Hunt this year due to an anticipated lack of participation.

Congregational Nominating Committee:

The Congregational Nominating Committee provided an update report. A request was made to the Session from the committee to allow the CNC to consider lowering the number of Elders to be elected for the class of 2025 from 4 to 3. It was stated that if it was determined later that 3 elders were detrimental to the church leadership and operations, the number could be increased to 5 next year to balance the class or a special election called later this year to fill the class to 4. The basis for this request was due to the reduction of active participation by members in church activities and participation. This reduction has made it difficult to identify potential nominees willing, able or qualified to nominate. A motion to allow this consideration in their discernment was approved by the Session.

Property Committee:

The committee is still obtaining bids for a sidewalk to the activity shelter.

A new deck has been installed outside the Fellowship Hall kitchen door.

Pastoral pictures have been rehung in the Session room.

The Committee is seeking bids for painting of the old Session room and door.

Cemetery records software is being installed on a computer in the church office.

Actions:

The Session approved a request to remove a tree in front of church that has been struck lighting.

The Session approved a request to remove and replace the light pole on the sidewalk with the Sunday School sign.

Worship Committee:

A request was approved by the Session to take up a special offering during the Maundy Thursday service to go to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance fund for the victims of the Ukraine war.

Additional Actions: The moderator requested that an AED be purchased for installation in the Family Life Center. A motion was made and seconded and without further discussion the motion was approved.
