On May 1st we will celebrate Homecoming at Bethesda. The invitations have been sent out. Calls made and the planning, as of this moment, is complete. There is a sense of anticipation and expectation growing around the church this week.

I *hope* that Homecoming is a meaningful weekend for us at the church. I hope we feel blessed as I also hope that we notice how God is close at hand throughout all that we have planned and implemented. Finally I hope that our worship and fellowship is meaningful and helps us grow closer together as a large community.

With this in mind, I was reading a book by M. Craig Barnes, the president of Princeton Theological Seminary and former teacher of mine in Pittsburgh, entitled: *Searching for Home Spirituality for Restless Souls*. As the title suggests, Craig undertakes a study of what the concept of 'home' looks like. We might be pressing on bravely in our lives as we search for God, moving from one job to new town to bigger house, but the truth is many of us feel that we are lost.

Midway through this book, Craig writes these words that I feel are applicable as we consider Homecoming and all that it can mean for our lives:

"I am always dismayed to find people who do the hard work of confessing the truth of how lost they've become, maybe even getting to the bottom of it, but they stop there and never head for home. . . No sin is greater than being too proud to come home once grace has made a way."

I wonder why do we not come home? Regardless of how we define home— home church, hometown, home with God, home with extended family, home with our new family—why do we hesitate to come home when the invitation is presented to us so often?

These are hard questions to consider. They ask us, as we wonder about home, to also wonder if we are lost? So lost that our lives resemble the Prodigal Son who didn't realize the impact of the choices that we have made. These questions make us wonder if we have become so lost, by our personal choices, that we cannot find a way home.

I am thankful that God is present for us in these moments. As you think about Homecoming here at Bethesda and reflect on it, perhaps take a moment and notice if you are lost or if you feel lost? God might be showing you this truth to bring you home yet again. . .

Session Highlights for April, 2022

The Session met on Sunday April 24, 2022. Nine of twelve members were present. Reverend Marotta provided a working session for Elders to reflect on 1 John 1:1-7. The Session then participated in a spiritual exercise in discernment by identifying topics that the session should spend time with that could lead to transformation in the church. The monthly financial report and committee reports were received as information.

The following committee highlights are reported.

Stewardship Administrative Committee

The Committee is investigating a means to provide on-line giving to our social media presence.

Actions:

The Session approved a request to **remove** the addendum which had been added to the Facility Use Policy fee schedule adding an additional fee for COVID special cleaning to facility rentals.

The Session approved a request to clarify the language in the Facility Use Police related to the reservation deposit and the cleaning fee for Fellowship Hall rentals.

Property Committee:

Cemetery records software has been installed on a dedicated computer to be installed in the church office.

Pastor's Report: The pastor has been working with several families who wish to join the fellowship at Bethesda. The Session is in the process of receiving letters of transfer and a date for joining and introduction.

A Note from the Church Nominating Committee:

After a time of prayer and listening, the nominating committee feels that it is both appropriate and God's will to nominate on 3 Rulings Elder for the class of 2025 rather than the traditional 4.

With this general introduction, here are their general comments and rationale for this choice:

"It was stated and determined that three elders were necessary for the church leadership and operation for this year. The number could be increased to five next year to balance the class out or a special election could be called later this year to fill the class back to four. The basis for this request was due to the reduction of active participation by members in church activities and worship. This reduction was made because it was difficult to identify potential nominees willing, able, and qualified to serve as Ruling Elders. The Session was consulted and agreed with this decision. Therefore we nominate by committee members the following individuals:

At a congregational meeting in June, we hope to formally approve this slate.
