Dear Friends,

Last night our Session met and made a prayerful decision to begin "in person" worship in the Sanctuary on Sunday, June 14. Please know that this is just an initial step as we begin our journey back to a worship service without any restrictions. Our service will begin at 10:00 am and will be 45 minutes in length. At this time, there will be no Sunday School. We will enter and exit through the side entrance of the church which will prevent any overcrowding in the narthex. Hand sanitizer will be provided at the entry door. If you feel that you would like to wear a mask, we would encourage you to do so. In fact, if for some reason you did not bring one of your own, we have a number available for you to use. Of course, family groups may sit together, but the Session asks you to maintain social distancing outside of your family for the duration of the service. Our elders on duty will usher you to your seat and only every other pew will be utilized. As you enter or leave the Sanctuary, there will be designated places where you can leave your offering. During the service we will enjoy instrumental music and refrain from singing. And, when the service is over, we will dismiss row by row. A more detailed plan of worship will be posted on the website www.bethesdapres.org

Certainly if you don't feel safe in venturing out yet, we understand and encourage you to continue to stay home and be safe. The service will be recorded every Sunday and available for you to view within a day or two. In addition, I will continue to offer a weekly Bible study on YouTube and invite you to listen in. Again, this is only a first step toward normalcy in our worship together. The Session will continue to monitor the situation during the pandemic and together we will continue our journey towards a worship where these worries are behind us and just a memory.

We are grateful for your continued support of Bethesda and ask for your prayers as we make this journey together. Remember, as we go through these days in Christ, we have everything to hope for and nothing to fear.



They may be dropped off in the church office Monday through Friday from 9 am to 1 pm.
