Due to Covid-19, the guests will not be eating in the fellowship hall. A table will be set up outside for the patrons to pick up their boxed dinner and drink. If it is raining, the table will be just inside the doorway. Volunteers are asked to wear a mask and gloves will be provided.

Do you recycle? If so, start saving your plastics because Bethesda is going to participate in the Trex Plastic Recycling Challenge! Save your grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, ziplock & other re-sealable bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags, and cereal bags. All materials must be clean, dry and free of food residue. A container will be placed on the Fellowship Hall porch to collect the plastics. If we collect 500 pounds of plastic by April 15, Trex will award us with a beautiful Trex bench. It sounds impossible; but it's not—hundreds of schools and churches have done this. The bench will be placed near the playground beside the Fellowship Hall.

Dimes for Hunger began in our Presbytery in 1977. At that time, many people lost their jobs due to the textile mills closing in our area. A plan came to mind: ask each member in each of the churches to give **One Dime - Per Meal - Per Day for the month of October for a total of \$9.30**. The Offering would be used to help provide food for our neighbors who were hungry. Now more than ever, our sisters and brothers need our help. Since this is the year 2020, we encourage you to double your offering to **Two Dimes -- Per Meal – Per Day for a whole month for a total of \$18.60**.

This year at Bethesda there will be three ways to make a contribution to *Dimes for Hunger*. A bucket will be placed at the front of the sanctuary so that those attending worship on Sundays may donate. Another bucket will be placed in the church office for those who wish to drop off their contributions during office hours, daily 9:00 AM through 1:00 PM.
