Everyone involved in this conversation agreed that the social deterioration and suffering was harming large swaths of people. They agreed that we cannot come together as a people (let alone as the Church Universal) and begin to offer helpful solutions rather than finger pointing and judgment.

I sat quietly for large parts of the meeting absorbing the wisdom of others and trying to make sense of what they were asking.

I left the meeting without a clear answer or direction; I knew I had more thinking and more considering to do before I could begin to articulate a response. Then something happened and my perspective changed. . .

A little before 10pm my phone chirped on the nightstand. I received a text. Then another one with a picture. After my initial text-response the phone rang and I had a conversation. Slowly as I listened an offer took shape. We could care for others in a new way— a new necessary way. And this is the transformational part that I was seeking from God when I left that conversation group.

Perhaps God is not asking us to "save the 'soul of the nation." Perhaps that is not something that you and I can do. Indeed large scale changes and adaptions need to take place, but I don't have the reach necessary to be effective in changing anything outside of this community.

Perhaps God asks us not to worry only about the big macro issues, but be present here. God asks us to listen to our neighbors when they are in need; when they are hungry, when they are sick. As I read my Bible it seems that Jesus is less interested in large scale changes initially in the world. Certainly they would happen as the name of Jesus was preached and the gospel spread.

I suspect that Jesus was more interested in going to the home of a father whose child was dying, or stooping down to hold the hand of a women who society deemed an outcast. Jesus was more interested in sitting beside a well and having a good conversation with a scorned child of God rather than stand on the sidelines of life and judge what he witnessed.

The Savior preferred to share a meal with friends and weep with the grieving. He preferred to embrace the littlest of the world and called the sinners to climb down from their trees and enjoy being together.

Maybe that is how we "save the soul of the nation?" We care for them in our little corner of MCconnells Highway just outside of York. Maybe that is enough and maybe that is what God calls for?
