When the church calendar slows down a bit, an opportunity arises in each of us. We have the chance to examine the story that we share about Bethesda with our community. We can share with them the good things that God is doing here.

Stories shape us; they define us. Our stories help reinforce beliefs and behaviors regardless of whether the story is positive or negative. A story is more than a tool to communicate information, a story helps define us. In our church, each story that is shared becomes an opportunity either grow the narrative of how God is active at Bethesda, or it can also speak about how God is not active here. The choice is ours and it is based in large part on how we share our stories.

Susan Beaumont, whose work in church leadership has helped move the church through the pandemic and out into their community, wrote these words for us:

"In spinning its stories, a congregation makes meaning out of its environment."

That is a powerful statement when we think about how the story of Bethesda impacts this community. But Susan does not stop at that point. She continues by citing Thomas Boomershire who says: "Story is a primary language of experience. Telling and listening to a story has the same structure as our experience. One of the ways we know each other is by telling our stories."

And so I wonder about what stories are you sharing about God's presence at Bethesda. We all appreciate and love to notice the sign hanging over the church door that says, "as you leave this place you enter the mission field." We readily affirm this truth, but I wonder how are we living into that missional call by sharing our stories with our community?

Indeed there are negative stories at every church, but the challenge and the danger lies in letting those negative stories shape how we encounter and engage our community. So perhaps as you have some time with family and friends, notice the stories you share. . . Perhaps you might find a chance to share the story of how God is at work at Bethesda?
