This is a publication of the people of Bethesda Presbyterian Church As the Church we are about to enter the season of Lent. On Valentine's Day, we will begin our journey towards the cross of Jesus. We will begin with communion on Transfiguration Sunday (2/11). Ashes will be administered in the worship space on Wednesday evening to mark the start of the season.

Overall, plans are being formed for a meaningful Lenten season for each of us with devotionals and special offerings. The choral anthems will reflect the seasonal change as the words take on a stronger message. We will partake of the Seder meal in the fellowship hall and participate Tenebrae in worship.

Using language from this past weekend, we are familiar with this season, and its story, ad nauseum. We know every step and moment of the story of Jesus' suffering. It can be repeated passage by passage.

But let us resist the temptation to trivialize or downplay the significance of the passion of Jesus. This season can transform us if we give it the space and the time necessary. The choice is ours.

I read the story of a local church that struggled with this idea. They were so excited about Easter that they ran right past the cross of Jesus and began passing out chocolate crosses on Palm Sunday. A member of the local community stopped one of the members and asked why were they doing this? Did they not know that Jesus still had to die on Maundy Thursday?

Confused about the death of Jesus, and where this question was coming from, the church-member responded, 'it's really not a big deal. He is risen. The death-stuff is not that important anyway.' And then they gave the person a cross and a big hug.

While I do agree that Jesus gains the final victory over death. We must not rush too quickly past the suffering of what Jesus does on the cross for us. Our sin. His death. His willingness to die for us cannot be neglected; it must not be neglected. Even if we have heard it before, and even if we have read the story countless times, we must read it again. Think on it again. Notice it again.

For in the retelling of the story we find the power and transformation living. So, I invite you this Lenten season, to spend time with this familiar account. Let it change you. Give it room in your heart. You might be surprised how God speaks to you!

Join Us for Ash Wednesday Service February 14



Ash Wednesday is the first day of the 40 days of **Lent**, a six-week period (not including Sundays) dedicated to reflection, repentance, prayer, fasting, and spiritual discipline. It is observed in preparation for Easter and ends on Holy Thursday before Easter Sunday. Holy Thursday marks the Last Supper. The Lenten season was established in the 4th century. It is observed by Catholics and several Protestant denominations.

Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality. The service focuses on both themes, helping us to realize that both have been triumphed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The ashes, applied in the shape of a cross on the fore-head during an Ash Wednesday service, are a symbol of penance, mourning and mortality. Centuries ago, participants used to sprinkle themselves with ashes and repent much more publicly, but the practice fell away sometime between the 8th-10th centuries before evolving into what it is today. The Session requests that worshipers refrain from bringing beverages into the sanctuary. Bottled water and cough drops are available in the narthex for an emergent need.

The Session considers the consumption of beverages during worship not in keeping with the sanctity of worship. As a practical matter the increased consumption of beverages during worship has resulted in an increase in the number of incidents of spilled beverages. The sanctuary floor is designed to slope downward towards the pulpit, thereby increasing the chance of an accident. Clean-up efforts during the service are a distraction to other worshipers and may require extra work for the sexton.

Session Highlights - January 2024

During the January Session meeting elders reflected on the blessings and spiritual growth of the fellowship at Bethesda in 2023. Time was spent in prayer, focusing on a forward outlook to where God is calling us in 2024. It was realized that we have an ability to upscale our impact on the community by continuing to step out in faith to the Lord's calling.

The Session approved 11 communion dates for 2024. This represents an increase in the desire to be more unified in our communion with Christ throughout the year. During the Lenten season, the church will again observe Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday, which will include a Sedar meal. On Resurrection Sunday new members will be joining the Bethesda fellowship.

On February 18th we will hold our annual congregational meeting immediately following the worship service. At that time the 2023 Annual Congregational Report will be presented. In addition, the congregation will elect four members from the congregation to serve on the Elder Nominating Committee. This committee, with prayer and discernment, will seek to find three faithful individuals who are called by God to serve on the Session as the class of 2027. A brief meeting of the Corporation will also be held immediately after the congregational meeting. The President of the Corporation for Bethesda will present the Annual Corporation Report.

The Session approved six special offerings to be collected this year, They are One Great Hour of of Sharing, Pentecost, Dimes for Hunger, Joy Gift and Christmas Eve offering. The special offering to support the Benevolence Fund is collected on the fifth Sundays that occur during the calendar year. The Administrative Committee has developed opportunities for making digital contributions. In 2024 members will be able to contribute to their annual pledge, special offerings, and specific ministries using a digital link. Information on how to access this option will be forthcoming shortly.

The Session joyfully accepted a recommendation from the Christian Education Committee to offer Laura Merritt the position of part-time Director of Christian Education. Laura will be responsible for designing and implementing a program of Christian Education for all ages. This will include developing opportunities for Bible study, fellowship, recreation, outreach, and retreats for all ages. Many of such opportunities are already in place and ongoing. Join us in supporting Laura in her new calling. Members desiring to provide financial support to the Christian Education and Youth ministries may do so with a dedicated contribution to this growing ministry.

Bethesda's support of local and foreign mission projects will be upscaled in 2024. New opportunities for missions will be visioned and staffed with committed project leaders. Mission project leaders will be responsible for developing and implementing specific mission opportunities. We began 2024 by building on our monthly food distribution in January, led by Karen Percival. We also will be planning the next community lunch distribution when schools are out of session in February.

Elder Shepherds will be supporting our church families in the coming year. Updated church directories and shepherd fold lists will be released in the next few weeks. The Session is excited about the opportunities to which God will call us in the next year. We invite you to draw closer to God as we worship and glorify him through our worship, Bible study, prayer and service in the kingdom of God.
