This is a publication of the people of Bethesda Presbyterian Church One of my Christmas practices that I enjoy is reading John Milton's poem, *On the Morning of Christ's Nativity*. In my faith walk I make time to read and consider the poem every Christmas season.

John Milton is a tough author to read; his language is challenging and his word usage is complex. But for those who persist through they will find Milton offering powerful, descriptive words and phrases for us that consistently teach and encourage us.

As the New Year is beginning I offer you a section from John Milton and invite you to reflect in 2024 on what he is saying. (And yes, some of the words seem misspelled. Trust me, they are not. This was written in 1629).

"That glorious form, that light unsufferable,
And that far-beaming blaze of majesty
Wherewith he wont, at Heav'n's high council-table
To sit, the midst of Trinal Unity,
He laid aside, and here with us to be
Forsook the courts of everlasting day,
And choose with us a darksome house of mortal clay."

As I said John Milton's language is hard to read at times. . . but John also understands something theologically that we should not just remember during Advent. The lesson and example of Emmanuel should stay with us.

Consider the sacrifice of Jesus.

Yes, he will suffer a horrific, isolating death. Yes, on the cross Jesus will be separated, for the first and only time, from His Heavenly Father. We know that on the cross Jesus reaches back out to God in heaven and, because of our sin, Jesus is unable to dwell with His Father any longer.

But consider the sacrifice Jesus willingly made for us in Advent. Consider that Jesus spent all of time and space in total communion with God, and in the incarnation he left that place, as Milton suggests, and chose to be with us. Jesus chose to adopt a 'darksome house of mortal clay.'

Never needing a physical body in heaven, Jesus sacrifices total communion with God to be with us. To sit with us. To hold us. To heal and save us. He willingly laid aside the glory of heaven to walk among humanity.

We know that Jesus took on our humanity fully. After being with us, Jesus shares our practical, human, experiences. Hunger. Thirst. fatigue. Sore joints and muscles, I believe, he knew something about what these feel like.

Yet, he chose this. Willingly and fully. This is a lesson that should not remain in our hearts in Advent only. Perhaps as the new year begins you and the Lord can take some time to talk about how much Jesus sacrifices to be with us.
