Everyone experiences the cold differently—and it has been quite cold recently. For me, I have experienced the cold in the dead and dark of night as Flynn needs to go out between 2 and 3 am.

While Flynn has been out in the cold at night, I have had some interesting experiences (besides wishing that I was back inside where it was warm). Most notably, I have experienced the lure and draw of stillness with the Lord. As I headed out with him, I did not anticipate that these experiences would become worshipful moments—but they were. While I breathe deeply, and watch the warmth of my breath head up toward the Lord, I imagine that my prayers taking on a similar shape and structure with God.

So, on many of those nights I wondered: is stillness with the Lord a call that we as the Body of Christ can lean into as we seek to serve our community?

The reason that I want to consider leaning into stillness with the Lord is that at any given moment we are bombarded from every direction with people, with news, and with notifications that seek our attention and our time. These things chip away at us from every direction until we feel like we have no space left to breath or to seek the Lord. On any given day we can hardly venture anywhere without feeling that little buzz in our pocket that begs us to look the other way.

And that draw includes an invitation to look away from God; put down our scriptures and become overly busy trying to learn and experience everything that is taking place at any given moment. We only have so much attention to offer, and too often that attention is not given to being with God.

This takes me back to standing in the dark with Flynn.

As I stood there, on those cold, cold, dark nights. There was nothing to do but 'be still, and know that He is God.' Sure, I was watching to make sure that Flynn did not wander too closely to the street or venture into the woods. But that is not terribly hard work and it did not require much more than standing between him and his intended target.

While I did that, I was free to look at the stars on those clear nights. Listen to the sounds of the winter in the trees. Marvel at how God perfectly places each star in the sky and listen to the sound of the crunching under my feet. Each event was an opportunity to remember that God loves me, my family, and my church . . . knowing all the time that if God places those stars in the sky, then God will certainly be present when I need the Lord.

And so, I am still before the great God of creation who watches over all of the world. I wonder if that is a practice you could practice as well?

Notice of the 2025 Annual Meeting of the Congregation

The Session has called a meeting of the congregation on Sunday February 16, 2025, immediately following the worship service for the purpose of receiving the Annual Ministry Report and to elect 4 members from the congregation to serve on the 2025 Congregational Nominating Committee (CNC). The CNC is responsible for nominating individuals from the congregation to serve in Elder Class of 2028. Nominations from the floor to serve on the CNC must have prior approval from the individual and the individual must be present.

The Board of Trustees of the Corporation for Bethesda Presbyterian Church York, South Carolina has called a meeting of the corporation to immediately follow the congregational meeting. This meeting will be for the purpose of presenting an annual report to the Corporation.

The 2 Session members on the **nominating committee** for 2025 are Steve Childers and Laura Merritt. We are looking for 4 members of the congregation to serve on the nominating committee with them for the 2025 year. The main purpose of this committee is to present the congregation with a slate of nominees for elders for the 2028 class to be elected by the congregation. If you have big items, we can also arrange for someone to pick those up.

Dear Church Family,

The Property Committee wanted to make you aware of some changes to burial and cemetery fees that will become effective **March 1, 2025**. These fee changes are still favorable when compared to other churches and cemeteries.

Below is the schedule of pricing and definition of each category.

Status

MEMBER - From \$400 to \$800 - Members of Bethesda Presbyterian Church.

AFFLIATED - From \$800 to \$900 - immediate family members of someone buried in the cemetery. An immediate family member includes : Father, Mother, Son, Daughter, Brother, Sister, step-father, step-mother, grandparent, grandchild or spouse.

COMMUNITY - From \$1200 to \$!500 - Anyone other than the status identified above, with no immediate family ties to the cemetery per the affiliated member definition, ie., community citizens, friends or associates of the church.

Additionally, the Property Committee is exploring the purchase of a columbarium, a permanent structure within the cemetery with inbuilt spaces (niches) that house inurned cremated remains. The Cemetery policy still allows for cremains to be buried in plots. A Columbarium allows for an alternative. Two sets of cremains may occupy one niche. The question for the congregation is how much interest is there in that option. He cost of each niche would be \$600 for church members.

Lastly, you may ask for a copy of the newly written Cemetery Policy by contacting Pat in the office. Please contact a member of the Property Committee if you have any questions or concerns.
